This Week's Gospel - Mark 9:2-10

Six days later Jesus took with him Peter, James, and John, and led them up a high mountain, where they were alone. As they looked on, a change came over Jesus, and his clothes became shining white—whiter than anyone in the world could wash them. Then the three disciples saw Elijah and Moses talking with Jesus. Peter spoke up and said to Jesus, "Teacher, how good it is that we are here! We will make three tents, one for you, one for Moses, and one for Elijah." He and the others were so frightened that he did not know what to say.

Then a cloud appeared and covered them with its shadow, and a voice came from the cloud, "This is my own dear Son—listen to him!" They took a quick look around but did not see anyone else; only Jesus was with them.

As they came down the mountain, Jesus ordered them, "Don't tell anyone what you have seen, until the Son of Man has risen from death." They obeyed his order, but among themselves they started discussing the matter, "What does this 'rising from death' mean?"

Attendance Update

Schools can fine parents for the unauthorised absence of their child from school, where the child is of compulsory school age.

Guardian Angels have now had to fine 8 families following Birmingham City Council guidelines

If issued with a penalty notice, parents must pay £60 within 21 days or £120 within 28 days. The payment must be made directly to the local authority..

If the payment has not been made after 28 days, the local authority can decide whether to prosecute the parent.

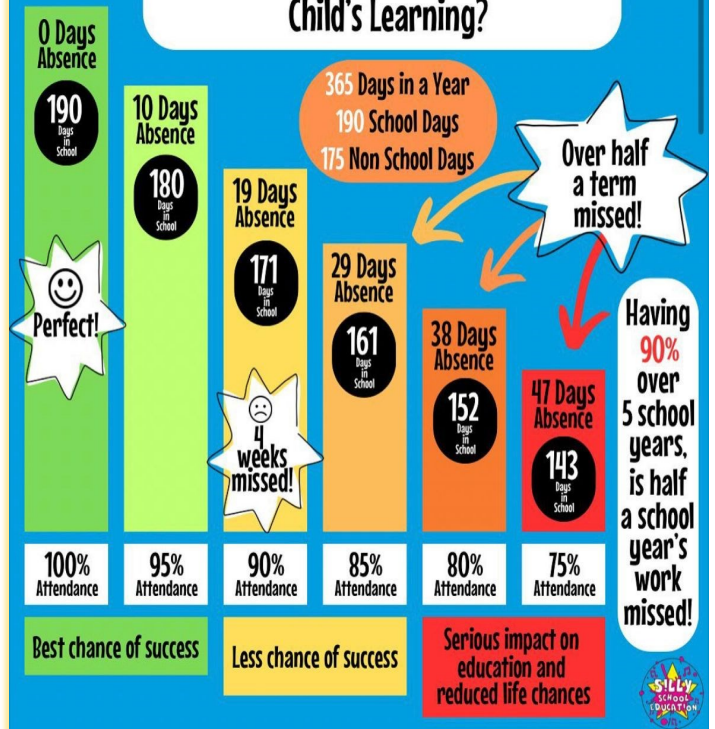
Attendance Support

Just before the holiday, all schools in England received a message from the Secretary of State for Education, outlining the concerns linked to attendance nationwide. Whilst our attendance has improved and the number of children below 90% attendance has decreased, there is still work to be done. Attendance will remain a huge focus for the whole school this year.

Safeguarding Tip of the Week

Substance Misuse

This week, our focus is on parental substance use. Parents who have a substance use problem can have chaotic, unpredictable lifestyles and may struggle to meet their children's needs. This may result in their children being at risk of harm, parents who have a substance use problem may have difficulty: staying organised and giving their children effective and consistent support, keeping their home and family clean or recognising and responding appropriately to their own and their children's physical needs. Parents who drink excessively or have a drug use problem can also become emotionally unavailable to their children. Another effect may be that a child may have to take on the role of carer for their family. This could include doing the housework and looking after younger siblings.

Composer of the Week

Listen here: https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=00yC4vbyTSc</p>	<p>Classical (19th/20th century)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Born in Gloucestershire, Ralph Vaughan Williams was related to Charles Darwin and the ceramics giant Josiah Wedgwood. Young Ralph studied piano and violin and collected traditional folk songs from an early age. These tunes went on to inspire many of his subsequent works. Vaughan Williams studied at the Royal College of Music in London. He also spent a short time continuing his studies in Berlin. In 1907-1908, Vaughan Williams studied orchestration in Paris with Ravel. It inspired one of his most fruitful periods of composition. Vaughan Williams' most popular piece, The Lark Ascending, was written in 1914 but the outbreak of World War I meant he had to put its premiere on hold. Aged 41, when World War I began, Vaughan Williams served in France and Salonika. Prolonged exposure to gunfire began a process of hearing loss that eventually caused severe deafness in his old age. Vaughan Williams was rather sentimental about military bands which he recognized as being crucially important to the UK's cultural and community life. So in 1923 he composed English Folk Songs Suite for them. Vaughan Williams was still composing great music into his 80s.

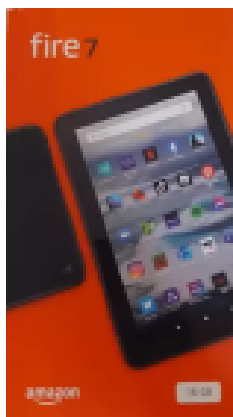

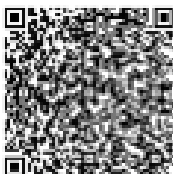

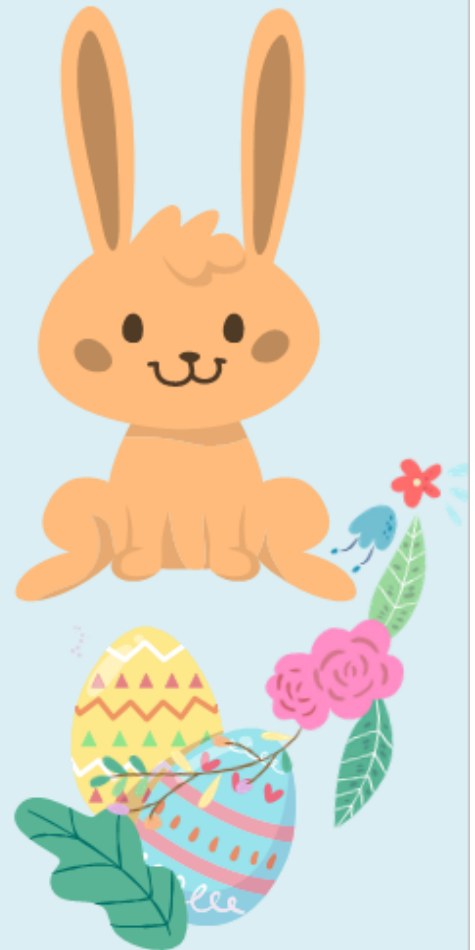
