This Week's Gospel - John 2:13-25

It was almost time for the Passover Festival, so Jesus went to Jerusalem. There in the Temple he found people selling cattle, sheep, and pigeons, and also the moneychangers sitting at their tables. So he made a whip from cords and drove all the animals out of the Temple, both the sheep and the cattle; he overturned the tables of the moneychangers and scattered their coins; and he ordered those who sold the pigeons, "Take them out of here! Stop making my Father's house a marketplace!" His disciples remembered that the scripture says, "My devotion to your house, O God, burns in me like a fire." The Jewish authorities came back at him with a question, "What miracle can you perform to show us that you have the right to do this?" Jesus answered, "Tear down this Temple, and in three days I will build it again." "Are you going to build it again in three days?" they asked him. "It has taken forty-six years to build this Temple!" But the temple Jesus was speaking about was his body. So when he was raised from death, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and what Jesus had said. While Jesus was in Jerusalem during the Passover Festival, many believed in him as they saw the miracles he performed. But Jesus did not trust himself to them, because he knew them all. There was no need for anyone to tell him about them, because he himself knew what was in their hearts.



Schools can fine parents for the unauthorised absence of their child from school, where the child is of compulsory school age.

Guardian Angels have now had to fine 8 families following
Birmingham City Council guidelines

If issued with a penalty notice, parents must pay £60 within 21 days or £120 within 28 days. The payment must be made directly to the local authority..


If the payment has not been made after 28 days, the local authority can decide whether to prosecute the parent.

Safeguarding Tip of the Week

NSPCC - What to do if you are worried about a child.

If you are worried about a child, even if you are unsure, you can speak to the NSPCC about your concerns. Whether you want to report child abuse and neglect or aren't sure what to do, they are there to listen, offer advice and support, and can take the next steps if a child's in danger.

If you wish to remain anonymous, you don't have to tell them who you are, where you live, or share your contact details.

If you think a child is in immediate danger, please call the police on 999 straight away.

Bronski Beat

Pop - 80s synth/Pop



- in the mid-1980s, particularly with the 1984 chart hit "Smallto
- Boy
 The initial line-up, which recorded the majority of the band's hits consisted of Jimmy Somerville (vocals), Steve <u>Bronski</u> (keyboards, percussion) and Larry <u>Steinbachek</u> (keyboards & percussion)
- percussion) and Larry <u>NeinDagCnek</u> (keyDoards & percussion). Somerville left <u>Bronski</u> Beat in 1985, and went on to have succes as lead singer of the Communards and as a solo artist.

 He was replaced by vocalist John Foster, with whom the band continued to have hits in the UK and Europe through 1986.

 Foster left <u>Bronski</u> Beat after their second album, and the band used a series of vocalists before dissolving in 1995.
- Steve Bronski revived the band in 2016, recording new material
- with 1990s member lan Donaldson
 The bands sound was very much synth pop which features the synthesizer as the dominant musical instrument
