The Faith in Action Group would be grateful of any donations for their tombola - these can be handed to the main school and would demonstrate this half terms virtues: Grateful and Generous.


A Note from Mrs Milligan and Mr Spindlow

SAFEGUARDING REMINDER: New School Times

Thank you to parents and pupils for being on time for school every day, even with our earlier start time of 8.55am. Gates close at 8.55am. If you arrive after this time, an adult must walk pupils in through the main entrance and sign in using the electronic system.

WOW Project

Our Walk Once a Week (WOW) project launches in school on Monday. This initiative is to encourage pupils to walk to school at least once a week. Pupils who walk one day each week will receive a very special badge at the end of each month- there are 11 to collect this school year.

What qualifies as walking to school?

- -Walking the whole journey to school
- Riding a bike or scooter to school**
- Parking at least as far as Morrison's and walking the rest of the way to school
- Getting off the bus a stop early and walking the rest of the journey


Grateful:
