The majority of our children now need to stay at home until further notice.

Please note that this is a national closure – as you may have heard in the news – so, while it is a challenging situation, we are not alone. We will re-open fully as soon as we can and will let you know when this is by text message and on our school website.

Whilst school is closed, we will keep in touch with you in the following ways:

- The school website will be updated with any new information
- The text message service will be used to send short messages
- The weekly newsletter will continue with key information and notices. This is available on our school website. If you have signed up to the service, this is emailed directly to you.
- The schools Twitter account will be updated with any new information

Phone Calls Home

- If you receive support from social services, you will receive phone calls from a Designated Safeguarding Lead to speak **to you and your child twice per week** and where possible a home visit will take place.
- If your child has additional needs, whether this is a Special Educational Need or Pastoral need, you will receive phone
 calls from a member of staff in their class and/or our SENDCO Mrs Potter, to speak to you and your child twice per
 week.
- All other pupils will receive a phone call once every two weeks, to speak to you and your child ideally this will be from a member of staff in their class.
- These calls will be from the main school number or a NO CALLER ID number. Where possible, we will strive to send a text to alert you to the day of call.

What we'll continue doing while your child is at home:

Your child's learning is of course important to us, so we'll continue to help your child to learn in the following ways:

- In addition to the tasks sent home, children now have access to a 'Homework' tile on BGFL365. This provides a weekly plan and links to resources for classes to use.
- Our Twitter page has links to new resources and information that we discover daily.
- The school website has a wealth of resources and information such as:

This week's Gospel: John 11:1-45 or John 11:3-7, 17, 20-27, 33-45. Below is the shortened version.

The sisters sent Jesus a message: "Lord, your dear friend is ill."

When Jesus heard it, he said, "The final result of this illness will not be the death of Lazarus; this has happened in order to bring glory to God, and it will be the means by which the Son of God will receive glory." Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. Yet when he received the news that Lazarus was ill, he stayed where he was for two more days. Then he said to the disciples, "Let us go back to Judea." When Jesus arrived, he found that Lazarus had been buried four days before.

When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him, but Mary stayed in the house. Martha said to Jesus, "If you had been here, Lord, my brother would not have died! But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask him for."

"Your brother will rise to life," Jesus told her.

"I know," she replied, "that he will rise to life on the last day."

Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life. Those who believe in me will live, even though they die; and all those who live and believe in me will never die. Do you believe this?"

"Yes, Lord!" she answered. "I do believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who was to come into the world."

Jesus saw her weeping, and he saw how the people who were with her were weeping also; his heart was touched, and he was deeply moved. "Where have you buried him?" he asked them.

"Come and see, Lord," they answered.

Jesus wept. "See how much he loved him!" the people said.


But some of them said, "He gave sight to the blind man, didn't he? Could he not have kept Lazarus from dying?"

Key Worker Provision

You will have received a text this week with information about Easer Holiday provision. This is for parents/carers who are key workers and there is NO ALTERNATIVE than for your child to be looked after at school during the Easter Holidays.

Provision is offered for the following dates only:

Week 1- Monday 6th April- Thursday 9th April (NO PROVISION AVAILABLE ON GOOD FRIDAY)

Week 2- Tuesday 14th April - Friday 17th April (NO PROVISION AVAILABLE ON EASTER MONDAY)

As this is over the Easter Holiday, one of two strict criteria that must be fulfilled to be eligible. REMEMBER, THIS SHOULD ONLY BE USED IF THERE IS NO OTHER ALTERNATIVE. Your child is safer at home, observing social distancing.

- 1. You are a Key Worker and are a single parent where there is NO CONTACT with second parent
- 2. BOTH parents are Key Workers with unavoidable cross over of shifts

PLEASE NOTE: this provision may be at a different location and there may not necessarily be Guardian Angels staff present. Arrangements will be confirmed with parents of children who are accepted.

The online form MUST be completed by SUNDAY 29TH MARCH 2020. NO FURTHER APPLICATIONS WILL BE CONSIDERED AFTER THIS DATE
