This Weeks Gospel: Matthew 20:1-16

"The Kingdom of heaven is like this. Once there was a man who went out early in the morning to hire some men to work in his vineyard. He agreed to pay them the regular wage, a silver coin a day, and sent them to work in his vineyard. He went out again to the market place at nine o'clock and saw some men standing there doing nothing, so he told them, 'You also go and work in the vineyard, and I will pay you a fair wage.' So they went. Then at twelve o'clock and again at three o'clock he did the same thing. It was nearly five o'clock when he went to the market place and saw some other men still standing there. 'Why are you wasting the whole day here doing nothing?' he asked them. 'No one hired us,' they answered. 'Well, then, you also go and work in the vineyard,' he told them.

"When evening came, the owner told his foreman, 'Call the workers and pay them their wages, starting with those who were hired last and ending with those who were hired first.' The men who had begun to work at five o'clock were paid a silver coin each. So when the men who were the first to be hired came to be paid, they thought they would get more; but they too were given a silver coin each. They took their money and started grumbling against the employer. 'These men who were hired last worked only one hour,' they said, 'while we put up with a whole day's work in the hot sun—yet you paid them the same as you paid us!'

'Listen, friend,' the owner answered one of them, 'I have not cheated you. After all, you agreed to do a day's work for one silver coin. Now take your pay and go home. I want to give this man who was hired last as much as I have given you. Don't I have the right to do as I wish with my own money? Or are you jealous because I am generous?'"

And Jesus concluded, "So those who are last will be first, and those who are first will be last."





















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Home Learning

COVID19 UPDATE

As a school within a Government identified 'High Risk' area that is subject to strict social distancing conditions, it is our duty to ensure that anyone presenting with **ONE or more** of the above named symptoms does not enter or remain in school.

This means that any adult or child that begins to develop

these symptoms in school, or if a parent reports these symptoms developing at home whilst not in school, they will be advised that the child must not be in school until one of the following happens:

- a) A negative test result has been returned
- b) The pupil has self-isolated for at least 10 days.

If your child's condition changes, unfortunately we are not able to change our advice.

COVID19 symptoms are similar to those of other ailments, and no member of school staff can distinguish between a 'seasonal' cough, high temperature causes or reasons for loss of taste or smell. The only way to rule out COVID19 is through testing or isolating for the specified time. School must carry out the instructions of Public Health England to ensure the health and safety of each and every pupil and staff member.

Guardian Angels will always act upon the advice of the Government, Diocese, Local Authority and Public Heath England, we will not change procedures based on how other schools locally are implementing their plans.

We understand the frustration that the inadequate capacity of testing and track and trace systems is currently experiencing, but we cannot and will not compromise on our pupils or staff health and safety.

Please Be Kind

Unfortunately, during this difficult time, some parents have taken their frustrations out on staff members. This will not be tolerated. We are a Catholic school and expect that parents and carers treat our staff with the respect and dignity that they deserve. Our staff are all carrying out their role under very difficult circumstances and are implementing the rules as laid out by Public Health England. Staff cannot change or bend these rules, irrespective of requests to do so.
