A Message from Mrs Milligan

Like many, our staff at Guardian Angels have been shocked by the news of such high COVID related deaths and the number of daily new infections.

Lord, we pray for all those who are sick or have passed away due to this horrific virus. May their families take comfort in knowing they are now with You. Amen

Thank you all for engaging so well with our remote learning offer. I also really appreciate your feedback on the offer from those parents who were able to complete it. It has highlighted some areas that we will continue to develop—further updates each week.

Critical Worker Places: The government have made clear that 'Children with at least one parent or carer who is a critical worker can go to school or college if required, but parents and carers should keep their children at home if they can.' Our provision is nearing capacity and unfortunately due to suspected misuse of the provision, we will now have to seek formal evidence of critical worker status from those already attending—if no evidence can be provided, the place may be removed. More information will be sent directly to this group of parents. If you can keep your child at home you should—even if you are a critical worker—this provision MUST only be used if there is NO OTHER OPTION—your child is safer at home.

Live Sessions: I am so impressed with the live sessions. There has been great uptake and it means our children can interact with each other whilst at home whilst learning too. The sessions are developing day by day and the children's knowledge and use of technology is phenomenal! The support from the majority of parents has been outstanding. Well done everyone.

Unfortunately, we have had a small number of incidents where inappropriate comments have been made by adults in the background of the teams sessions. This is completely unacceptable and inappropriate and if this were to happen again, we will have no alternative but to remove the participant from the session. Our staff and children deserve to be treated with respect and dignity in a safe learning environment.

Free School Meals: The fantastic news that the government are reinstating the Free School Meals vouchers for eligible pupils came this week. As soon as we are granted access to the ordering system next week, we will place orders on our families behalf. You will receive your e-code vouchers by Email from Edenred.

One of the key areas to come out of the survey was:

'the frustration with some online documents being PDFs and no access to printers.'

To help with this, we have ordered paper based White Rose Maths workbooks with all of the sheets needed for your child's maths lessons, as well as CGP English workbooks. We are eagerly awaiting arrival of these resources.

As soon as they arrive, we will be asking you to come and collect them from school, which will be staggered to avoid distancing issues. This has been a significant financial investment and we hope that this will improve access to remote learning even further for families.

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Using Xbox or PlayStation to access BGFL365

Accessing your remote learning, An alternative method of accessing remote learning during times of lockdown

Xbox

- 1. Plug a Keyboard in to the Xbox USB slot
- 2. Go to my games and APPs
- 3. Find Microsoft Edge and select
- 4. Type BGFL365 as you would in school
- 5. You can then access BGFL365 including:
 - -Word
 - -Teams
 - -PowerPoint
- 6. To move around you can use the Xbox control or plug in a mouse.

PlayStation

- 1. Identify the PlayStation Internet Browser icon (it is WWW with dots around it)
- 2. Press the PlayStation logo on the computer
- 3. Go to the library and find options for games and applications
- 4. Go in to applications and you will find the internet browser
- 5. Type BGFL365 into the browser
