Living Streets 5 Day Walking Challenge

From Monday 17th May until Friday 21st May, Guardian Angels are taking part in the 5 day walking challenge. This involves children and families trying to walk, cycle or scoot to school each day. Don't worry if you live too far away to walk to school, you can also park and stride by parking your car 5-10minutes walk from school and completing the rest of the journey on foot or get of the bus 2 stops early!

Each day a child walks to school, they will receive a sticker. If they collect 5 stickers they will receive a unique walk to school badge at the end of the week.







This small change in our journey to school will benefit our health, community and the planet so get walking!

Home Learning:

This should be used if your child is at home and they are well enough to complete learning. Work should be uploaded for the child's teacher to see. Please take into consideration that teachers are teaching full time.

Term Time Holidays

Term time leave for pupils can **NOT** be authorised unless they meet 'exceptional circumstances.' The impact of COVID 19 does not meet the exceptional circumstances criteria and although we appreciate that this has been a very tough time for everyone, children have had such an amount of time away from school, more time away from school will further impact their educational progress.

General Reminders

- Summer uniform can now be worn—please see the school website for further details. If you choose for your child to wear the 'winter' uniform, this includes a school tie.
- On PE days, PE kits should be worn to school—this must meet the uniform policy and include the correct items.
- Long hair should be tied back at all times. We have had a growing number of reports regarding head lice this week.
- Jewellery, such as plain stud earrings must be removed on PE days.
- Sun hats can be worn at play time and lunch time when there is hot weather.
- We are a 'Sun Safe' school. Sun Screen/protection spray can be bought into school but must be labelled with the child's name and class and must not be shared with others. Children will need to be able to apply this themselves.
- Every child should bring a fresh water bottle to school to keep hydrated throughout the day.
- Packed lunches must contain healthy foods; please try to avoid sugary snacks. No fizzy drinks are allowed in school. Further work will begin on healthy packed lunches soon.

School Uniform Provider

Due to increased issues with being able to supply uniform using our current provider, we are currently exploring new options for a school uniform provider. It is the intention for this to outsourced to a third party— this means that uniform would not be sold through the school office and there would be no delay with school having to wait for minimum order quantities. We are looking into options that would include an 'in store and online' solution. As soon as we have more information, we will share this with our parents.
