This Week's Gospel—Matthew 17:1-9








Letter from Sir David Attenborough

Who to talk to if an issue arises

Please follow the steps below when reporting any issues in schools:

- 1. Speak to the staff in class. They know your child best and usually are able to answer most questions about your child, issues through the day or playground fall outs.
- 2. Phase Leader. For EYFS and KS1 please talk to Miss Carroll. For Year 3 and 4, please speak to Miss Hickey. For Year 5 and 6, speak to Mr Johnson.
- 3. Pastoral Lead / Acting Head of School. For issues that can not be resolves with step one and 2, please request a meeting with Mr Spindlow or Mrs Tennant.
- 4. Interim Executive Head Teacher. Depending on the circumstances, it may be appropriate to meet with Mrs Milligan (A reminder that Mrs Milligan is not on site part of the week)
- 5. Complaints procedure. Although we are confident that most issues will be able to be resolves quickly, please see the website for the schools formal complaints procedure



Composer of the Week

Bronski Beat





Years Active: 1980's Nationality: British

Famous piece of music: Small-town Boy

- Bronski Beat were a British synthpop trio which achieved success in the mid-1980s, particularly with the 1984 chart hit "Smalltown Boy"
- The initial line-up, which recorded the majority of the band's hits, consisted of Jimmy Somerville (vocals), Steve Bronski (keyboards, percussion) and Larry Steinbachek (keyboards & percussion)
- Somerville left Bronski Beat in 1985, and went on to have success as lead singer of the Communards and as a solo artist.
- He was replaced by vocalist John Foster, with whom the band continued to have hits in the UK and Europe through 1986.
- Foster left Bronski Beat after their second album, and the band used a series of vocalists before dissolving in 1995.
- Steve Bronski revived the band in 2016, recording new material with 1990s member Ian Donaldson
- The bands sound was very much synth pop which features the synthesizer as the dominant musical instrument

























Safeguarding Tip of the Week

NSPCC - What to do if you are worried about a child.

If you are worried about a child, even if you are unsure, you can speak to the NSPCC about your concerns. Whether you want to report child abuse and neglect or aren't sure what to do, they are there to listen, offer advice and support, and can take the next steps if a child's in danger.

You can call the NSPCC on 0808 800 5000 or email help@NSPCC.org.uk.

If you wish to remain anonymous, you don't have to tell them who you are, where you live, or share your contact details.

If you think a child is in immediate danger, please call the police on 999 straight away.

E- Safety Tip

Staying safe online

Don't post any personal information online – like your address, email address or mobile number

Think carefully before posting pictures or videos of yourself. Once you've put a picture of yourself online people can see it and download it, it's not just yours anymore

Keep your privacy settings on social media accounts as high as possible

Never give out your passwords

Don't befriend people you don't know

Don't accept friend or follow requests from people you don't know

Don't meet up with people you've met online speak to a trusted adult about anyone who suggest you do

Remember that not everyone online is who they say they are

School Attendance – a very important message for all parents/carers September 2022

Important - please read!

3rd March 2023

Dear Parent/Carer.

This is an important update about school attendance for the 2022/23 academic year.

Guardian Angels Catholic Primary School is working in partnership with parents and the Local Authority to improve school attendance.

A big thank you to the majority of parents who make sure their children attend school regularly!

Your efforts, working in partnership with the school, will ensure that your child will have the best chance to achieve their academic potential and have real opportunity in further education and the world of work. It will also enable your child to:

- access the lessons needed to achieve their expected grades
- maintain friendships and develop new ones.
- have access to social and sporting events offered by the school
- explore potential careers
- develop work habits such as good punctuality which are essential to thrive in the world of employment

How does your child compare?

Attendance during one school year	equals this number of days absent	which is approximately this many weeks absent	which means this number of lessons missed
95%	9 days	2 weeks	50 lessons
90%	19 days	4 weeks	100 lessons
85%	29 days	6 weeks	150 lessons

If you are worried about your child/children's attendance the first port of call is to discuss your concerns with the school directly. The school has specialist staff who may be able to help, and all schools work closely with health and council teams who



























may also be able to help if needed. If you have concerns about mental health; domestic abuse; parenting; bereavement; finance; problems with drugs and alcohol; you can find help and support from the 'From Birmingham with Love' webpage:

Additionally, Birmingham City Council provides online information and guidance to parents on school attendance which you can access here: School Attendance Information for Parents

Family holidays in term time are not allowed in law and are unlikely to be authorised. Family emergencies also need careful consideration. It is not always appropriate or in the best interests of the child to miss school for emergencies which are being dealt with by adult family members. Notifying the school of leave due to a family emergency does not mean it will be authorised.

Please note that where parents fail to ensure their child attends school regularly, legal action, including penalty notices, may be considered.
