#### This Week's Gospel - John 3:14-21

As Moses lifted up the bronze snake on a pole in the desert, in the same way the Son of Man must be lifted up, so that everyone who believes in him may have eternal life. For God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not die but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to be its judge, but to be its saviour.

Those who believe in the Son are not judged; but those who do not believe have already been judged, because they have not believed in God's only Son. This is how the judgment works: the light has come into the world, but people love the darkness rather than the light, because their deeds are evil. Those who do evil things hate the light and will not come to the light, because they do not want their evil deeds to be shown up. But those who do what is true come to the light in order that the light may show that what they did was in obedience to God.





#### **Attendance Update**

Schools can fine parents for the unauthorised absence of their child from school, where the child is of compulsory school age.

Guardian Angels have now had to fine 8 families following
Birmingham City Council guidelines

If issued with a penalty notice, parents must pay £60 within 21 days or £120 within 28 days. The payment must be made directly to the local authority..


If the payment has not been made after 28 days, the local authority can decide whether to prosecute the parent.




#### **Safeguarding Tip of the Week**

Kishori Amonkar

Musical Tradition -Indian Classical Country - India



Died: 3 April 2017 Nationality: Indian

- Kishori Amonkar was an Indian classical vocalist. She is considered to be one of the foremost singers in the Hindustani tradition and is an innovator of the Jaipur gharana, or a community of musicians sharing a distinctive musical style
- Amonkar trained under her mother, classical singer Mogubai Kurdikar of the Jaipur gharana (musical tradition of Jaipur) Amonkar experimented with a variety of vocal styles in her career. She is considered one of the pre-eminent representatives of Hindustani classical music

  She became interested in film music and did sing in a 1964 movie
- but returned to classical music because of bad experiences in the
- Amonkar lost her voice for two years in the late 1950s for unknown reasons
- One of her famous pieces was Sahela Re
